Bios

Anja Czymmeck

Director of the Konrad Adenauer Foundation (KAS) in Brazil since August 2019, Anja Czymmeck has a master's degree in linguistics and geography from the University of Bonn. She was a scientific assistant to members of the North Rhine-Westphalia Parliament and the European Parliament (Brussels and Strasbourg). Subsequently, from 1998, she held different positions at KAS. At the foundation's headquarters in Berlin, she was responsible for projects in Western, Southeastern and Northern Europe, and desk officer on the team for Latin America, among other positions. Abroad, she was a project assistant in Venezuela and representative of KAS at the offices in Fortaleza / Brazil, Macedonia and Kosovo.

Anna Jaguaribe

Director of the Institute for Brazil China Studies (IBRACH) and Trustee of the Brazilian Center for International Relations (CEBRI). Sociologist with a PhD from the New York University, she lived and researched in China from 1998 till 2003. She has worked at the United Nations in New York, has been a consultant to the UNCTAD in Geneva and a Professor at the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro.

Mariana Mazzucato

Professor in the Economics of Innovation and Public Value at University College London (UCL), where she is Founding Director of the UCL Institute for Innovation & Public Purpose (IIPP). She received her BA from Tufts University and her MA and PhD from the Graduate Faculty of the New School for Social Research. Her previous posts include the RM Phillips Professorial Chair at the Science Policy Research Unit (SPRU) at Sussex University. She is a selected fellow of the UK's Academy of Social Sciences (FACSS) and of the Italian National Science Academy (Lincei).

Monica de Bolle

Senior fellow at the Peterson Institute for International Economics, is adjunct lecturer and former director for Latin American studies and emerging markets at the School of Advanced International Studies at Johns Hopkins University. Prior to joining the Institute, De Bolle was professor of macroeconomics at the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro, as well as managing partner of Galanto | MBB Consultants, a macroeconomics advisory firm. She was also a director of the Institute for Economic Policy Research (IEPE/Casa das Garças) and an economist at the International Monetary Fund. De Bolle obtained her BA in economics from the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro and holds a PhD in economics from the London School of Economics and Political Science.

Izabella Teixeira

Former Minister of the Environment and Co-President of the International Panel of Natural Resources of the UN Environment (IRP / UNEP). She is also a member of the UN-DESA High Level Advisory Council and President of the ACRJ Environment Council. For a long time in her career, Izabella Teixeira held different administrative positions at the Ministry of the Environment, the Government of Rio de Janeiro and IBAMA, where she joined in 1984. She played a key role in the negotiation of the Paris Agreement and was appointed, in 2012, to serve on the High Level Panel of Eminent Persons for a Post-2015 Development Agenda. In 2013, she won the Global Award “Champions of the Earth”, from the UN Environment, for her contribution to reduce deforestation in the Amazon. She has a master's degree in Energy Planning and a PhD in Environmental Planning from COPPE / UFRJ.
