KISHORE MAHBUBANI

Distinguished Fellow, Asia Research Institute

National University of Singapore



A veteran diplomat, student of philosophy, and author of eight books, Kishore Mahbubani is currently a Distinguished Fellow at the Asia Research Institute, National University of Singapore. Mahbubani is also a former President of the UN Security Council (Jan 2001, May 2002) and the Founding Dean of the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy (2004-2017). Mahbubani writes and speaks prolifically on the rise of Asia, geopolitics and global governance. His eight books and articles in the New York Times, Washington Post, Financial Times and Foreign Affairs have earned him global recognition as "the muse of the

DAVID DAOKUI LI

Director, Academic Center for Chinese Economic Practice and Thinking (ACCEPT)

Tsinghua University



Professor David Daokui Li is a leading Chinese economist. He has been a Mansfield Freeman Chair Professor of Economics of Tsinghua University since 2006. Together with Eric S. Maskin, 2007 Nobel Laureate of Economics, he is a Co-president of the Society for the Analysis of Government and Economics (SAGE). He also served as the founding Dean of the Schwarzman College of Tsinghua University from 2014 to 2017. His research and teaching cover a wide range of economic fields, including government and

economics, economic development, comparative economics, and the Chinese economy.

RUBENS RICUPERO

Trustee Emeritus at CEBRI



Minister Ricupero is Director of Faculdade Armando Álvares Penteado (FAAP) in São Paulo. He was Secretary General of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) for almost a decade. Previously, he was Minister of Finance, Minister of Environment and Legal Amazon and Special Advisor to the President of Brazil. He served as Ambassador to the United States, Italy, the United Nations in Geneva and he headed the Brazilian delegations to the UN Human Rights

Council and the UN Conference on Disarmament. He was Professor of Theory of International Relations at the University of Brasilia and Professor of History of Brazilian Diplomatic Relations at the Rio Branco Institute. Minister Ricupero received a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of São Paulo. He is the author of several books on international relations, economics, trade, history. His latest work is Diplomacy in the Construction of Brazil 1750-2016.





GELSON FONSECA JR.

Trustee at CEBRI



Ambassador Fonseca was a career diplomat between 1968 and 2016, when he retired. Today he is Director of the Center for History and Diplomatic Documentation (CHDD) of the Alexandre de Gusmão Foundation (FUNAG). He was previously Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York, Ambassador to Chile and Consul General in Madrid and Porto. He served in various capacities in Brazil, at the office of the President of the Republic and in the State Department, where his most recent

position was as Inspector General of Foreign Service. He was Professor of International Relations Theory at the Rio Branco Institute between 1980 and 1998. Ambassador Fonseca received a Bachelor of Laws from Guanabara State University (now UERJ) and a Master of Arts degree in Latin American Studies from Georgetown University. He holds a PhD in International Relations from the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul. He has numerous publications on international issues

Tatiana Rosito is a diplomat and an economist, having worked over ten years in Asia, where she served at the Brazilian Embassies in Beijing and Singapore. She was Petrobras' Chief-Representative in China and General Manager for Business Development in Asia from 2017 to 2019. Previously, she was Executive Secretary at the Brazilian Foreign Trade Board (CAMEX) and Special Advisor to the Ministers of Finance and Planning, among other roles in the public service. She is also an invited member of the Consultative Committee of the Brazil-China Business Council. She holds a Master's degree in International Development from the Harvard Kennedy School and an Executive MBA from INSEAD and Tsinghua University.
